WHAT IS BREAKAWAY?

Breakaway is a 5-day, 4-night summer camp program that focuses on deepening students' relationships with Christ through dynamic worship services, engaging lessons, and exciting daily activities and team competitions. Students who have **completed** 1st through 6th grades are eligible to attend! Our 1-2 camp is for 1st & 2nd grade graduates; our 3-6 camp is for 3rd through 6th grade graduates. Both camps run simultaneously but separately to allow us to zero in on developmentally appropriate lessons and games to serve each student the best we can.



WHAT'S THE DAY LIKE?

Each camp day will begin with breakfast, team competition, and outdoor/lake activities. After lunch, the students will meet for the afternoon rally (service) before participating in more activities on the campgrounds. The final rally takes place after dinner, and the day winds up with free time, when the students can enjoy ice cream from the cafe, or more games in the Activities Center.

WHAT IS THERE TO DO?

Lake Williamson features so many outdoor and indoor activities for the students to choose from. Some of those are a lakefront/beach area including the blob, canoes, paddle boats, and water slides, indoor/outdoor pools, archery, mini golf, high ropes adventures, rock climbing, football/soccer/kickball fields, blacklight dodgeball, and so much more!

WHAT ABOUT THE RALLIES?

Sure, we play lots of games at Breakaway, but we're serious about our rallies! Each day, students gather together with our camp speaker for an awesome time of worship, learning, and growth that we pray leaves a lasting impression.



WHERE WILL THEY SLEEP?

Lake Williamson features over 180 guest rooms in five buildings across campus. Lodging at Breakaway is dorm style, so each student will be housed with 8 other campers (on average) and one counselor. We place students in rooms based on the group housing form we receive from the camp coordinator!

HOW ARE COUNSELORS CHOSEN?

Most counselors are pastors, leaders, or parents who attend with students from their churches. Others are volunteers with a heart for children's ministry who have sacrificed a week of their vacation to invest in the lives of students. We couldn't do camp without them! All counselors must submit to a national background check, provide both pastoral and personal references, and complete training in order to attend as a counselor at Breakaway.

WHAT ARE COLOR TEAMS?

Once the housing process begins, each room of students will be assigned a team color, and will participate in team competitions all week to earn points for their team. At the end of the week, the winning team will enjoy a pizza/pool party!
